Mazovia Region at a glance

📌 Located in central-eastern Poland, Mazovia is home to 5.6 million people, including 1.8 million in Warsaw – the nation's capital and economic heart.



➡ It borders with 6 others voivodeships. Its area of 35,558 km² - makes it the largest voivodeship by area in Poland.

Industry key players...



Mazovia is the wealthiest and most economically developed region in Poland.

Generates over 22% of the national GDP. Main economic sectors are:

- Modern, service-based economy in Warsaw and its metropolitan (largest contributor to GDP. Strong in finance, insurance, ICT, real estate, public administration, and education).
- Agricultural and industrial base in outer regions of the voivodeship (includes petrochemical, machinery, food processing, printing, pharmaceutical, and automotive components).

The biggest EII company is PKN ORLEN in Płock – the largest refinery in Poland.
